I am a writer and filmmaker helping to spread the word about indie Christian filmmakers via my Faith Flix bloq. First, tell us about your educational background.

I attended Druid Hills High School which was next door to Emory University. An avid athlete in high school, and dreams of becoming a professional NBA star, I lettered in basketball, football and track.

Upon graduating, I accepted an academic and basketball scholarship to Gordon State College. In only my second year at GSC and averaging 25 points per game, I became the #1 three-point shooter in the state of Georgia and 3rd in the nation. I received a full-ride basketball scholarship to Western Carolina University (Div I). My dreams of becoming an NBA player were now within reach. I chose to concentrate in Sports Medicine as a major. Unfortunately, I suffered a career ending injury to my shooting hand and had to focus on academics. I completed an internship at the #1 Georgia ranked Health South Orthopedic Clinic. After completing my internship and graduation ceremony (1996), I never worked in the field of Sports Medicine. So began my journey.



What led to you transition from basketball star to entrepreneur?

Looking to find the same purpose in life that I had with basketball, relocating to Asheville North Carolina seemed reasonable at the time. I became an assistant manager at Footlocker and later manager of Wilson's Leather. After record-breaking success in sales, I began to realize my passion for sales, management and people interaction. After 5 years in Asheville, I decided to move back home. Picking up where I left off, I became a salesman for Radio Shack. After 3 months and garnering the #1 salesman in the region title, I was offered a management position and new store. I jumped at the opportunity! I helped to build the store from the ground up; hiring employees, setting up computer systems and organizing all inventory. After a few successful years with RadioShack, I parted ways to explore new ventures. In 2002, I decided to help my father's ministry and once again became the audio/visual director (with no formal training). Multimedia had changed drastically and I had my work cut out. I began to read books and experiment with various software. In August of 2003, during my church's 21st anniversary, I decided to make a movie on our history using a 8mm digital camera and Windows Movie Maker. After much trial and error, I created an exciting film consisting of picture slides and video from old VHS tapes. The church loved it and applauded the work with an inspiring ovation. Later, someone approached me and asked, "How much would you charge for a slideshow? I can pay you \$100." I found my purpose and in January 2004, I started One Vision Productions. After several years of working at the church and producing my father's TV show (The Giver of Life), I knew my time to leave was drawing near. In 2011, The Giver of Life won the Atlanta Interfaith Broadcast (AIB) Allen Award for best programming. I always feel it's best to leave on top. So, I began my journey as full-time CEO of One Vision Productions, LLC. Soon after making this decision, I was inducted into the Gordon State College Inaugural Basketball Hall of Fame in 2012. One chapter ends and another one begins.






#### What is your goal as a filmmaker?





Confidence is a film that deals with the trials of bullying (physically and online) that a young teenage girl has to deal with. In this movie, she struggles to find her place in the world and other people's bad dispositions, personal circumstances and self-hate become the catalyst for Confidence's low self-esteem. The project is significant to me because it deals with a prevalent issue in our society. This problems also extends to celebrities, people of various color, weight, religious preference and sexual orientation. Bullying in any form is hurtful and may have a catastrophic impact or outcome on a person or situation

I truly enjoyed working on this project. The DeKalb County School system will use the film as an anti-bullying PSA. I am very thankful to have had my wife India, Creative Dream Alliance, Dynasti (singing group), Principal Oliver Dean II, Principal, Dr. Marchell Boston and Freedom Middle School support this project. The lead characters, Sydney Tuff (as Confidence) and Jordan Tuff (Bully) are my two daughters. It was truly a joy working with them and completing a film that has had some success. A couple of the songs in the film belong to my brother Marcus Tuff "Sabbyth." He passed in 2011, shortly after completing his album and a month before he graduated from Full Sail University. We were very close and shared a love for music. I promised him that I would not let his music go unheard. So, it was very special to use music from his album "Pop Rockz" to help create a mood for different scenes.






What was your inspiration for writing a children's book?

At night, when I would put my two eldest daughters to sleep (when they were younger) and tell them made-up bedtime stories. One night, they said, "Dad you should write a book, your stories are the best!" Inspired by their belief in me, I started Happy Hopes Books. Using the pen name Horrace Forrest, I wrote my first children's book entitled, *Things I Like 3-D*. The reversible book comes with a pair of 3-D glasses and free audio cd. Once you have read the book with your 3-D glasses, flip it over and read it again without them.

Things I Like 3-D has simple sentence structure and strives to equip kids with reading skills which are aligned with today's reading standards. As a result, a child's knowledge of letters and sounds will be strengthened through phonemic awareness, repetition of sight words, and segmenting and blending sounds through pairs of rhyming words and initial consonants in single-syllable words. The publication was used in the DeKalb County School System at the elementary level. In 2010, I was nominated for the Georgia Author of the Year Award by The Georgia Writers Association.


